Alvillar was one of 300 students in kindergarten through third-grade at Potrero School to receive a new pair of athletic shoes during the Shoes That Fit event on Jan. 23. Shoes That Fit is a Claremont-based nonprofit that battles poverty by giving children new pairs of shoes with help from the community.

Potrero School's event was sponsored by Kaiser Permanente Baldwin Park Medical Center, which began gathering donations in November. Several nurses from the hospital attended the event and handed out shoes to the overjoyed children.

Students received a variety of brands from the community, including Adidas, Nike and Converse.

"We've participated in Shoes That Fit for many years at Kaiser – supporting the community is a major part of Kaiser's mission," Kaiser Permanente Baldwin Park Chief Operations Officer Michelle Nowicki said. Providing children with new shoes is an excellent way to improve self-esteem, attendance rates and class participation, Shoes That Fit Vice President of Strategic Partnerships Nekeda Newell-Hall said.

During the event, Potrero School welcomed its benefactors with applause and hugs while the school's Mariachi Academy performed "De Colores" and "La Bamba."
