Lynwood Unified High Schools to Hold Michelle Obama College Signing Day

WHAT: As part of a nationwide call to action by former First Lady Michelle Obama, hundreds of Lynwood High students will take their first step toward college during College Signing Day, a White House program initiated in 2016 to encourage all students to attend college and support those planning their college ventures.

This is the second year Lynwood Unified is taking part in the initiative.

During the first of two college-signing events, 477 Lynwood High seniors on April 26 will host a "Decision Day" to announce their post-secondary education/career plans and will commit to those plans by signing a large poster in front of a crowd of underclassmen, hoping to motivate all grade levels to strive toward their college goals.

Lynwood Unified's Firebaugh High will host a similar College Signing Day for 377 seniors on May 18.
