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San Ysidro Fifth-Graders Head to BizTown to Gain Real World Experience

WHAT: Students from San Ysidro School District's La Mirada and Sunset elementary schools will run their own

10,000 square foot mini-town as they discover how the "real world" works by managing businesses, writing checks and operating banks. Approximately 167 La Mirada and 133 Sunset fifth-graders will become Junior Achievement BizTown "citizens" where they will make financial decisions, work in one of

21 businesses, pay taxes and donate to charity.

This is San Ysidro School District's first time attending BizTown.
