Washington Elementary School to Unveil \$40,000 Robot-Equipped Computer Lab

Screen time will be reimagined for Washington Elementary students when the school unveils a \$40,000 computer lab donated by International Game Technology (IGT) during a grand-opening celebration. The lab will be stocked with 40 Chromebooks, 20 iPads, coding system programs, printers, a flat screen television and moveable furniture.

The lab is the first donated by IGT that will also feature robotic equipment, such as the Dash and Dot Wonder Pack, Osmo Wonder Kit, Littlebits Gizmo & Gadgets and a Sphero programmable robot.

Guest speakers include IGT Senior Vice President Scott Gunn and California State Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon.
