After graduation, Morua plans to attend a four-year university and pursue a career in sports business, with an eye toward media or game-day operations for a professional baseball team.

Torres has made the most of Chaparral-Vista High School's offerings, participating in Renaissance, yearbook, volleyball, and the annual "Pick of the Litter" competition, and was a member of the junior prom court. She is also dually enrolled at Citrus College, where she takes classes in English and history. After graduation, Torres plans to continue her education at Mt. SAC and study interior design.
