Students were greeted with red carpets, lively musical performances, cheers, shaking pom-poms, fist bumps, and high-fives as they walked onto campus. At the same time, parents said their goodbyes and captured the festivities and excitement on camera.

El Monte Union kicked off the academic year with historic upgrades across its five comprehensive high schools, thanks to the District's Modernization Program. Mountain View and South El Monte high schools now feature refreshed landscapes and quads, providing enhanced spaces for student activities and events.
