126 Bellflower Unified Students to Receive Free Eye Exams through Bellflower Rotary

- WHAT:** Bellflower Rotary Club, in partnership with Caring Connections, is bringing the nonprofit Vision to Learn to Washington Elementary to provide 126 students with eye exams from licensed optometrists. The students were selected after a screening that showed possible impairment or a history of vision problems. Those who need glasses will be able to choose from among up to 25 options. Glasses will arrive two to three weeks after exams.
- WHEN:** 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday, March 30; Tuesday, March 31; and Wednesday, April 1
- WHERE:** George Washington Elementary School, 9725 Jefferson St., Bellflower
- DETAILS:** This is the first visit to a Bellflower Unified school by [Vision to Learn](#), which provides vision services to children in low-income communities. The [Bellflower Rotary Club](#) donated \$7,500 to bring Vision to Learn's mobile unit to Washington, and club members hope to secure the vision program for the District's other low-income schools. Club members also helped screen the students. [Caring Connections](#) is a nonprofit dedicated to helping meet the needs of children and families in the Bellflower Unified School District.
