CITY OF INDUSTRY – The energy was electric as Hacienda La Puente Unified students were ushered onto campus with friendly cheers from teachers and staff, motivational speeches, musical performances and lively welcome rallies to celebrate the first day of school on Aug. 9.

Across the District, each high school campus varied its celebrations to match their school spirit. William Workman High School rolled out the red carpet to give students a star-studded welcome to campus, bedecked with balloons and hand-painted welcome banners. Los Altos High School celebrated with a full day of activities, including an assembly about resilience led by inspirational speaker Dee Hankins, a dance party and team-building exercises.

Glen A. Wilson High School's band and leadership students greeted their peers with a lively performance that led students to their designated class sections in the gym, where juniors and seniors taught incoming freshmen the traditional Wildcat song and chant and competed in various battle of the class games. Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps cadets and leadership students from La Puente High School greeted new and returning students with a tunnel walk while the school's band led spirited musical numbers to energize students as they arrived.

"The collaboration, school-themed decorations and family-oriented welcome festivities were a great testament to who we are as a District community," Board President Christine H. Salazar said. "On behalf of the entire Board of Education, thank you to everyone who had a part in our first day of school celebrations.
