Gladstone High Student is Finalist in Regional Art Contest, Hopes to Display Work at U.S. Capital

WHAT: Gladstone High School art student Vanessa Arias was named one of three finalists of the 32nd Congressional District Art Competition “An Artistic Discovery,” and has a chance to capture first prize and a trip for two to Washington D.C. to be recognized for her art work with other regional winners from across the United States.

The winner will be announced on **Saturday, May 7** at 8:30 a.m. at the Walker House in San Dimas (121 N. San Dimas Ave., San Dimas). Their art work will be displayed for one year in the U.S. Capital building.

Arias’ submission – titled “The Best Way To Quit Is To Never Start” – was one of 187 art pieces submitted by students from close to 20 high schools located in the 32nd Congressional District, governed by Congresswoman Grace F. Napolitano.
