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## Lynwood Unified to Hold Kids-N-Technology Summer Training for Students, Parents

## WHAT:

About 28 students and their parents will participate in Lynwood Unified School District's first Kids-N-Technology science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) summer training session, hosted by the District African American Advisory Parent Council (DAAAPC).

Students in grades five through 12 interested in pursuing STEM careers will receive hands-on experience in programming, coding and robotics as they create video games, phone applications and 3-D designs. Parents will follow along on their own computers, learning about programs their students will use throughout the upcoming school year.

Concurrently, DAAAPC parents will learn about additional ways to support their students, discovering new programs supported by the District's Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), school site council opportunities and the roles parents play in their child's success.
