Montebello Unified to Unveil Student Artwork Chosen for Districtwide Anti-Bullying Campaign

WHAT: Montebello Unified School District is committed to eradicating bullying on its campuses. As part of that effort, the Board of Education will unveil artwork by an Applied Technology Center student chosen as a centerpiece of its ongoing anti-bullying campaign.

District officials selected ATC junior Laura Rodriguez's design after a contest in which principals at each school selected one student's work for consideration. Rodriguez's artwork features a globe, a heart with the words "Kindness is Key," students holding hands and a banner with the slogan "No Bullying Zone." The design will grace anti-bullying signs that will be posted at all schools. Rodriguez is a student in the Health Science Pathway at the high school.

The unveiling event will feature remarks from the Montebello Unified Board of Education, Superintendent Susanna Contreras Smith, Rodriguez and ATC ASB President.
